Visit to Gilling Castle

Guided Tour by the Father Prior

The tour includes the history of the Castle, the State Rooms, the Great Chamber, the Long Gallery and the Cellars. A Buffet Lunch is provided in the State Rooms.

St Martin's Ampleforth is an independent school and the preparatory school for Ampleforth College. It is at Gilling Castle, North Yorkshire, The Castle (Grade I listed) was originally the home of the Etton family in the 12th century and a Manor House was built in the 14th century. The property passed through the Fairfax family until 1885; it was bought by Ampleforth Abbey in 1929.

Cost: £17 per person including lunch

Max No: 40 people

Directions: Take the B1363 road, accessible from Park Street in Hovingham (LH turn on Helmsley road (after the acute bend). Turn right before you get to Yearsley for Gilling East. At the crossroads in the village turn left at the Fairfax Arms and then left at the Village Hall.

There is the opportunity to independently drive over to Ampleforth College in the afternoon to look at the Abbey, the Visitor centre and shop. The Café offers afternoon tea which can be recommended.
